On Tuesday, September 25th the Canadian Hard of Hearing Association (CHHA) will be hosting an information session and screening from 2 p.m.-3:15 p.m. Unfortunately, the evening session is cancelled due to scheduling.

At the Canadian Hard of Hearing Association-NL (CHHA-NL) our goal is to provide programs and services that promote education and awareness about hearing loss while also helping with advocacy and accessibility across the province. We want to promote a better quality of life for hearing impaired individuals in Newfoundland and Labrador.

We have just recently started providing a program called *Here to Hear*. It focuses on the importance of seniors recognizing and treating their hearing loss. We usually have a volunteer senior, who is hard of hearing, inform the group about their hearing loss journey and then play a short video that's packed with some great information for anyone interested in their hearing health. This event will also include a hearing screening. A hearing screening can be a first step toward better hearing health. A screening is a guick test to see how well you hear certain sounds that are important for understanding speech. If you do not pass the hearing screening, you will be referred to a hearing health care professional for a complete hearing evaluation, including treatment options, if deemed necessary.
